## The Malcolm Kerr Endowment Update

In 2018, thanks to your generosity, over \$87,000 was donated to the Malcolm Kerr Endowment. With a little luck in the investment market our total for the endowment grew to over \$520,000 by January 2019. The 2019 donations began at the Salt Lake City reunion and to date \$33,465 has been contributed. Our goal is to grow the fund to a basis of \$600,000, the amount needed to generate enough annual income fully fund the tuition and expenses of one student at ACS. We are getting close.

Malcolm Kerr was in the ACS class of 1949. His classmates have fond memories of him as just a regular guy, a Boy Scout, and a good friend. Kerr dedicated his most extraordinary professional life to education in the Middle East. He gave his life to that cause when he was assassinated in 1984 while serving as the President of AUB. The leadership of the alumni association subsequently named a scholarship fund in his name. Today the Malcolm Kerr Endowment is the association's primary charity. Last year three of his classmates and one former ACS teacher made large donations in his honor while hundreds of ACS alumni made smaller contributions. One, a large donation, came with the attribution, to paraphrase, I couldn't think of a better place for the money to go, than to an ACS education for a deserving child.

The Malcolm Kerr Endowment is our initiative as an alumni association. It is our opportunity to pull together and demonstrate what we can do as a community. I hope you will consider making a donation that will put us closer to our goal before the end of the year. Please see the donations form on the back cover to donate by check or credit card.

## President's Letter

In January 2020 a new Alumni Council (AC) will be seated and a new leadership team will step forward to guide the alumni association of ACS for the next three years. It has been my honor to serve as the association's president for this term. Some really good things have happened thanks to your generosity and to the volunteer efforts of many ACSers.

The *Potrezebie* quarterly newsletter has now passed its 40-year mark of continuous publication. In the late 1970s **Peter Gibson Fac** and his mother, Halley, built a mailing list of former students and faculty. This led to a newsletter, and then to our first reunion, and to a surprisingly durable alumni organization. These have been dependable constants in a chaotic world, and that is no little achievement. In addition to the late and much missed **Jon Stacey '61** I wish to thank our current editor of the *Potrezebie*, **Linda Handschin-Sheppard '68**, for her extraordinary efforts in getting the newsletter out every quarter. Linda also pioneered the move to an electronic-only option for receipt of the *Potrezebie*. With the help of the ACS webmaster, **Hasan al-Masri Fac**, we have uploaded, with password protection, the forty-year archive of the *Potrezebie* to the ACS website. This publication has long been the glue that holds us together.

Kudos to **Melo Soghanalian-Hansen '77** and her husband Gary who, with their widely dispersed team of volunteers, staged a great triennial reunion at Salt Lake City. Already dubbed "the connection reunion," the friendships rekindled at this gathering serve to remind us why we so value the alumni association.

Your donations have built up the Malcom Kerr Endowment from less than \$400,000 to almost \$550,000. We expect that the endowment will soon be able to produce enough annual income to support the equivalent of one student's full tuition and student expenses at ACS.

The leadership of the alumni association is made up of former students who volunteer their time and initiative to sustain the organization. I would like to thank; **Andrea Aractingi '09** who headed our Communications Committee and explored our path ahead for social media; **Majd Maksad '00, Amer Ghandour '06, Ramzi Farah '07, Anna Salameh-Boustany '84, Margaret "Mug" Kelberer '73** who has previously served as secretary, and **Jeff Hutchins '65** who have all stepped up to volunteer their time and insights; **Maria Bashshur-Abunnasr '84 Fac** who served as our secretary and provided invaluable guidance based on her lifetime association with ACS; **Yasmin Agha '04** who extended herself to motivate her classmates to join in Lebanon-based

activities and for volunteering as our vice president; **Zeyd Tabbara '11** and **Joseph Farhat '03** who worked to establish a college mentoring network for juniors at ACS; and **Gina Kano '73** who served as reunion coordinator. **Pat Hinds '56** generously stepped forward six years ago to take over as treasurer and has been an able steward of the monies you have contributed. Our finances are in good shape, and we will miss Pat's steady hand when he steps down in January. Finally, **Bill Crays '56**, emeritus during this past term, has not received the recognition he deserves for his many years as our treasurer and then his term as association president for the 2013-2016. I need to extend personal thanks to the past association presidents including Bill, Pat, Jeff, Linda, **Sam Constan '53**, and my sister **Anne '70**, who have been a most helpful sounding board as I have faced decisions on the future of the organization.

Many things have changed at ACS. **Greg MacGilpin Fac** is providing outstanding leadership as Head of School as ACS weathers another period of political turmoil in Lebanon with the assistance of the Board of Trustees. ACS has survived these storms before and the alumni community has played an important role in sustaining the school during its greatest challenges.

The Office of Development and Alumni Relations at ACS has been through a number of changes in the past three years. **Rosie Muhanna Fac** is now firmly in place leading the office. **Lina Safa Fac** has been our invaluable contact in the office and has delivered countless administrative assists to help AA/ACS conduct our business and to help ACSers find their classmates. **Faten Hayeck Fac** has now joined the office and has taken on the massive task of maintaining the contact data base. Our close relationship with

Rosie and her office staff is essential to the future success of the association.

For the next term **Marwa Bader '97**, **Donna Harms-Hansen '74**, **Jeanie Mullin '73**, and **Betsy van den Berg '74** will all be joining the AC. Two additional volunteers have stepped forward to offer their services, and we have a provision to bring them on board at the discretion of the AC.

That brings us to the future of AA/ACS. We have compared notes with other alumni organizations and have some sense of what is coming. We know alumni involvement for the pre-1980 generations will decrease sharply as each class year group passes from age 70 to age 80. In other words, the association, as we have known it, must hand off to a new generation or wind down in the next 12 to 15 years. The classes of the 1980s were very small and post-1990 graduates, who are now in the majority, have never been heavily engaged with AA/ACS. While there have been some highly motivated individuals, they have not been able to attract a groundswell of their peers. Those generations certainly have a different set of life challenges and as current protests in Lebanon show. They are confronting truly profound issues for the future of the country and the world. I hope that in the next term the new AC with the help of volunteers in Beirut and around the world will be able to provide the focus for the next generation of leadership.

# Alumni Notes

**Bob Miller '60** writes from Florida that he attended and greatly enjoyed the class of 1961 mini reunion in Key West with a cruise to Cuba in May 2019.

Bob is also a published author, with six books out, about his life in the Middle East, he continues to publish in both the fiction and non-fiction genres. His next three books include scenes in and around Lebanon, involved in international terrorism, espionage, and betrayal – even on the streets of Beirut so familiar to ACSers. Late in 2019, *Telamon's World*, a love story trilogy set in the Middle East in the 4th century BC, will be available at [bobmillerbooks.com](http://bobmillerbooks.com) and Amazon and other online vendors.

Bob attended ACS in the halcyon days of the early 1950s and again in the mid-50s, and was raised in Turkey, Lebanon, Egypt, Italy, and Iraq where he attended a four-year university through 1966. His adult life was spent on the streets and in the towns of the above countries until he retired in 1994.

**Janis Jibrin '77** is a health writer and adjunct professor of nutrition at Georgetown University (also her *alma mater*). Since leaving Lebanon in 1975, she returned twice to the Middle East, visiting Beirut briefly on her way to Syria, where she still has cousins and other relatives. She lives in Washington, DC, a 25-minute drive from her brother **Richard's '79** family, and a 35-minute drive from her long-time "almost husband", Jack Merendino.

**Tony Seker '79's** works were presented by FLAG Art Group at its premiere show, All Media, All Cultures – Beyond Cultural Identities, curated by Nino Macharashvili. 

Remembering the consummate American diplomat—and my friend—**Paul Malik '78**

Going to Paul Malik's funeral this summer, it felt like some of my own history got buried as well. That's what happens, I guess, when a contemporary, and someone you've known your entire life, dies. We were family friends—our fathers worked together at the Voice of America, Arabic section, with posts in Washington, DC, Greece, Lebanon, and other Middle Eastern countries.

At the burial, vivid scenes of Paul popped up in my mind's eye, playing out like a film reel:

Paul, his brother **Peter '81**, my brother **Richard '79**, and I, as 5-to-8-year-olds, in Rhodes, Greece, playing tricks on the waiters at the Park Hotel. (You could always count on Paul for this kind of thing.) The hotel was our temporary home before my family settled on the island for what would be a six-year stint, just as the Maliks were leaving for Beirut.

Paul, in high school, becoming tall, bounding across the ACS courtyard, stopping to talk to me about politics (already!).

Paul, drink in hand, sparkle in eye, hosting a party at his Virginia home, at the start of what would become an astoundingly successful 23-year Foreign Service career. As always, drawing me in to his very interesting conversation. (His grasp of Middle East politics was unusually comprehensive, and you know how complicated that is!)

His high energy, buzzy parties were a trademark; talk to people who knew him in Dublin, Dubai, Athens, and any other post and their eyes light up recalling those soirees. His husband Nikos was determined to uphold the tradition in the memorial party he threw a few months after Paul's death. (It was a great time—joyous, charged, and very sad all at once.)

Paul, this summer, a few weeks before his death, sitting on the couch in the stately Northwest DC home he shared with Nikos. Emaciated from cancer treatment, he was still "Handsome Paul Malik"—the way **Helen Zughaib '77** and I always greeted him.

In his last post, as Charge d'Affaires in Amman, Jordan, he was responsible for about 2,500 employees. In that living room visit he was still talking about the Middle East and many other topics, including our families. I told him how grateful I was that during the last year of my father's life, when conversing with him was tough, Paul's father Boulos still faithfully visited. Paul recalled other encounters between our two families, many I'd forgotten. One after another they tumbled out, as if he too were watching a movie reel in his mind's eye.



**Richard Storm Fac** was born July 30, 1937 and died on October 19, 2019. Richard was born in Peekskill, New York. He graduated from Hamilton College with a dual degree in French and English Literature and a minor in Music. Following graduation, he took a job teaching English at the American School in Beirut, Lebanon and spent the next 30 years living and working in the Mediterranean basin area. He returned

to the United States in 1989 where he settled close to his family on the Gulf coast of Florida. He joined Fistere Associates, a public relations and tourism marketing firm with contracts in Lebanon and Jordan. Assignments as local producer for CBS and NBC television

documentaries were followed by a marketing consultancy for Bulgari. He owned and published English-language magazines in Cairo and Rome before moving to Sarasota as a free-lance marketing consultant, translator, and public relations adviser.

In Sarasota, he immersed himself in its culture as well as urban development. With all of his accomplishments, the high point of Richard's career came as president and then the first executive director of Key Chorale where he worked from 1994-2015. An avid music lover and expert, Richard was very visible in the community as a music critic for the *Sarasota Herald-Tribune* for many years, as well as for other publications in the United States and Canada. He also wrote a monthly column on architecture and urban planning at *Sarasota Magazine*.
